AMWD Pty Ltd is committed to the protection of employees from driver related accidents and incidents, out of, or in the course of their employment. AMWD will ensure all appropriate steps are taken to prevent these accidents in the workplace.


In the event of such an accident or incident, AMWD will ensure full investigation into the cause and seek to improve conditions through the enforcement of correct work procedures directly relating to the work being performed and seek to introduce new work practices to improve work conditions for all employees.

To achieve this, AMWD is committed to preventing injuries / illness associated with vehicle and transport movements.

- All drivers of company vehicles must be appropriately licensed with the correct class of license for the vehicle they are driving
- Obey all road rules in all states and territories in Australia and overseas including mine site rules and regulations
- Whilst driving a company vehicle ensure you abide by Drug and Alcohol and OHS Policies relating to your responsibility of duty of care at the workplace
- Prior to driving a vehicle, check lights, fuel, oils, water, brakes and spare tyre, jacks, first aid kits and fire extinguishers
- Wear seat belts where required
- Ensure vehicles are correctly loaded and secured in a safe and secure manner
- Use extra precautions before driving in difficult conditions
- Check depth and current strength before crossing creeks and approach slopes square on
- Ensure management is aware of your departure and arrival times at your destination
- Prepare for your trip by ensuring you have road maps, full fuel tanks, food and water supplies before departing

- Take precautions when travelling at night, in rain, fog or slippery conditions, and drive to these conditions
- Plan your trip and have regular breaks to check the equipment and load
- Keep look out for other vehicles or animals which may be on the road at night
- On any mine-site, before driving in restricted areas (haul-roads, pits, underground, etc.) ensure you have been trained in the mine site rules and issued with the appropriate permits
- Ensure all vehicle checks have been completed and compiled before entering mines
- Ensure the vehicle is equipped with a current copy of emergency contact numbers including the relevant emergency services providers in your travel destination
- Stay on designated roads and tracks and do no enter private property unless you have permission from the owner of his representative and always comply with environmental laws and practices.
- **Any use of company vehicles for private purposes MUST be authorised by management.**
